Dear Sir,

I write on behalf of The Dedham Vale Society (DVS), of which I am President.

The Society was formed 70 years ago to protect and enhance the natural and architectural amenities and tranquil landscape of the Dedham Vale Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB) and the four parishes due west namely Bures, Mount Bures, Alphamstone and Lamarsh, which it believes should be included in the AONB.

DVS believes that the second runway at Stansted is unwanted by the great majority of the inhabitants of Essex and Suffolk and is unnecessary, as future growth in air traffic should be spread through other parts of the UK such as the Midlands, North East and North West where there is demand, and local support for airport expansion exists.

Any further expansion of Stansted will result in further noise and pollution as well as loss of valuable countryside and destruction of ancient woodland and will be detrimental to the AONB, a major tourist attraction, which has already suffered severely from aircraft noise despite being officially designated as a tranquil area.

We strongly support Essex and Suffolk County Councils and Uttlesford District Council in opposing this planning application and urge its rejection.
